The costs associated with litter cleanup and prevention are often hidden. This session will explore how to communicate the story of litter and its costs to your community's quality of life. In addition learn more about the tangible costs of littering identified in the 2009 KAB Litter Cost Research.

Active Threat Mitigation: Tips for Surviving an "Active Killer" Incident

Active Threat Mitigation is a no nonsense, logical approach, to self-preservation. As the world becomes increasingly dangerous, we too must become more informed, aware, and prepared. Easy to grasp concepts presented will work for anyone and in any environment, to include schools, workplaces, churches, public retail venues and, even your home. Don't wait until it is too late to formulate a plan for survival.

Sovereign Citizens

This block of instruction gives the officer a look at the strange subculture of the Sovereign Citizen movement. What are some of the indicators and safety precautions when dealing with the sovereign citizen?

Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design

Public perception is that crimes of all kinds are rising and that public safety faces a greater and greater threat. This perception is not reality; however, even a perception of crime can paralyze business momentum and destroy the sense of security necessary for a thriving community. Fear of crime can result in a community in decline. Traditional crime prevention techniques such as target hardening can actually increase the perception of crime. Many communities are addressing this issue through the strategies of Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design (CPTED). CPTED contends that we can create a climate of safety that encourages the appropriate use of an area and discourages inappropriate behavior. The proper design and effective use of the built environment can lead to a reduction in the fear and incidence of crime and an improvement in the quality of life. The theory is based on four principles: territoriality, natural access control, natural surveillance, and maintenance. CPTED's goal is to prevent crime by designing a physical environment that positively influences human behavior.
